

CHIRRIPO 3 DAYS ECONOMIC TREK

3 days & 2 nights

Tour Description

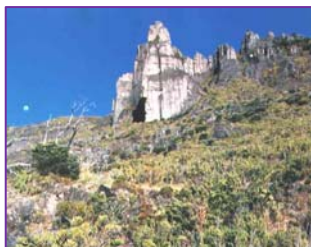


Day 1 Cerro de la Muerte: Drive on the Pan-American Highway (2 ½ hrs) heading south to the Chirripó Highlands and Cerro de la Muerte (Peak of Death, 11,000'). Our staging area for the trek, you spend the afternoon in the quaint village of San Gerardo de Rivas. Equipment check and dinner. **Albergue El Pelicano Lodge or Similar [Dinner]**



Day 2 Trek to Chirripó Base Camp: Depart in the morning to begin trekking into Chirripó National Park. Today you hike in three stages as you ascend the mountain, eating snacks and lunch before arrival at camp by midday. The uphill trail is steep and can take up to 12 hours in poor conditions for slow trekkers. Fit, experienced hikers can do it in 6 to 7 hours. After passing the sign "Trail to Chirripó", you begin a grueling uphill stretch called La Cuesta del Agua (allow 2 hours). This climb crests at Monte Sin Fe ("Faithless Mountain"). Expect to see colorful toucans, trogons, monkeys, and more as you pass through dwarf cloud forests draped in "Old Man's Beard" mosses. Note: A water filter is useful for re-filling your water bottle. There are not many water sources on this day. Camp is 6 km below the summit. **Overnight:**

Shelter in National Park [Breakfast, Lunch, & Dinner]



Day 3 Summit of Mount Chirripó: Arise very early to begin trekking to the summit of Mt. Chirripó before the fog rolls in. Chirripó National Park protects 50,150 hectares of high elevation terrain. Cloud forest above 8,250' elevation covers half the park. Along the way you will pass by numerous lakes and it is clear why the Talamanca Indians called this area Chirripó—"Place of Enchanted Waters." Enjoy the sunrise; the view to the Pacific and Atlantic is stunning. Continue descending to Refuge Los Crestones. After a second breakfast, you hike back to San Gerardo de Dota. **[Breakfast, snack]**

CLIMATE

Weather on Chirripó is unpredictable and potentially dangerous, if you are not prepared. Bitterly cold winds can exceed 100 Kph with significant drops of temperature. Rain is always a possibility, especially in mid-afternoon. Temperatures usually fall to freezing, or below, during the night.

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ESSENTIALS TO BRING

Sleeping bag rated to freezing
Good rucksack to carry your gear (or to give to an optional porter)
Plastic water bottle
Personal water filter to refill your water bottle. Recommended, but not necessary
Good rain poncho,
Warm clothes (layered, polypropylene) to keep warm in damp and cold mountains
Sunscreen and insect repellent
Cotton shirts - long and short sleeved
Parka
Trousers - light weight pants (jeans are not recommended-too slow to dry)
Short hiking socks
Hat(s) with visor for rain and sun protection
Flashlight with spare batteries
Bulb binoculars
FOOTWEAR – Lightweight hiking boots with traction and ankle support
Walking sticks are recommended.
Clothes for the hot springs.

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
